

The Second Reading

Romans 6:12-23

Do not let sin exercise dominion in your mortal bodies, to make you obey their passions. No longer present your members to sin as instruments of wickedness, but present yourselves to God as those who have been brought from death to life, and present your members to God as instruments of righteousness. For sin will have no dominion over you, since you are not under law but under grace.

What then? Should we sin because we are not under law but under grace? By no means! Do you not know that if you present yourselves to anyone as obedient slaves, you are slaves of the one whom you obey, either of sin, which leads to death, or of obedience, which leads to righteousness? But thanks be to God that you, having once been slaves of sin, have become obedient from the heart to the form of teaching to which you were entrusted, and that you, having been set free from sin, have become slaves of righteousness. I am speaking in human terms because of your natural limitations. For just as you once presented your members as slaves to impurity and to greater and greater iniquity, so now present your members as slaves to righteousness for sanctification.

When you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to righteousness. So what advantage did you then get from the things of which you now are ashamed? The end of those things is death. But now that you have been freed from sin and enslaved to God, the advantage you get is sanctification. The end is eternal life. For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

UPDATED Office and Church Guidelines during EXTENDED Phase II of COVID-19:

The NC Governor has extended Phase II until at least July 17th when the infection/death numbers would have to stabilize or decrease in NC. It is now also mandatory to wear face masks in all public places in order to stop the increasing spread.

In both the *Good News and Notes* and announcements I offered a reminder that even though the impact and resulting loneliness for so many individuals cannot be overstated, and the desire to connect, to return to some form of normalcy is strong, we **MUST** encourage you to connect via phone calls, emails, Facetime, participating in the weekly Zoom Bible Study, participating in the weekly Sunday service, calling Rev. Stephanie for a phone visit, or establishing an email connection with Rev. Stephanie. But as Phase II indicates, it is still Safer at Home right now.

What I want to add is how very much I too long to gather with all of you, see your smiling faces pop into my office and share a chat—all of those things that often brighten my day as the Rector/Pastor of this wonderful parish.

The horror of Covid-19 has visited my family up close and personal, and it has caused huge recurring health problems in a strong, healthy 30-something. My desire to “get back to normal” or

even a “new normal” is greatly tempered by this personal experience of Covid-19. And this was even with my beloved family member being very careful. When I am confronted with folks who are putting themselves and others at risk, I have a very strong response that is also born out of deep love and care for you and all.

I am continually working on ideas that could create safe gatherings so we can feel reconnected and as soon as any of those thoughts can be put into action, you will know!

Again, guidelines from the National and Diocesan office ask that no one come into the Parish except administrators, clergy, Parish leaders (Sr Warden, Jr Warden, Treasurer) on a strict as-needed basis, and Altar Guild members who set up for weekly services.

As hard as this is, we want to gently remind all of you that it is safer for everyone if you remain at home and don't come to the church right now. If you are one of the individuals noted above:

You MUST wear a face mask when entering the church, maintain 6 feet of distance from each other, wash your hands regularly and/or use hand sanitizer.

Given the size of the Administrator's Office, we ask that you enter no further than the doorway.

Face masks and hand sanitizer are available, as required, on a table to the right of the parish hall entrance door.

Plans are being made now so when it IS safe to be together again, we'll be able to do that. And as always, we'll keep you posted.
